BACHELOR DEGREES IN LAW

1. In addition to the Faculty Award Requirements candidates for Awards of the faculty must comply with the University Requirements for Undergraduate Coursework Awards listed in this handbook.
2. In exceptional circumstances and notwithstanding anything contained in the University Requirements for Undergraduate Coursework Awards and the Degree or Diploma Award Requirements, the faculty may in any case in which it may deem it appropriate to do so, dispense with or amend any conditions of or prescription of these Requirements.
3. Subjects available to candidates are listed in the Master Schedule of Subjects as subjects with a prefix of LA.
- 4.1 Candidates for awards of the faculty may apply to obtain advanced standing as detailed in the Advanced Standing for Previous Studies and Recognised Prior Learning Policy and associated procedures.
- 4.2 Candidates are advised that degree specific Award Requirements may specify advanced standing provisions unique to that degree.
- 4.3 Unless the faculty otherwise determines, advanced standing gained for any subject shall be cancelled 11 (eleven) years after the date of the examination upon which the advanced standing is based if by then the candidate has not completed the course of study prescribed for the degree.

DEGREES AND CERTIFICATES IN BUSINESS, COMMERCE, ECONOMICS, MANAGEMENT AND TOURISM**Application of the requirements**

1. In addition to the Faculty Award Requirements candidates for Awards must comply with the University Requirements for Undergraduate Coursework Awards listed in this handbook.
2. In exceptional circumstances the Pro-Vice-Chancellor, with the approval of the relevant Head of School, may dispense with or amend any requirements or prescription of the University Requirements for Undergraduate Coursework Awards, Faculty Award Requirements and Degree, Diploma or Certificate Award Requirements.

Enrolment in awards

3. A person who holds an Award listed in General Requirement 1.1 may not be a candidate for that Award in the same discipline.

Advanced Standing

- 4.1 Candidates for awards of the faculty may apply to obtain advanced standing as detailed in the Advanced Standing for Previous Studies and Recognised Prior Learning Policy and associated procedures.
- 4.2 Candidates are advised that degree specific Award Requirements may specify advanced standing provisions unique to that degree.
- 4.3 Candidates are advised that such advanced standing obtained may be subject to cancellation as specified within degree specific Award Requirements.
5. Subjects available to candidates are listed in the Master Schedule of Subjects as subjects with a prefix of BU, BX, CO, EC, MG or TO.
6. In exceptional circumstances the Pro-Vice-Chancellor with the approval of the relevant Head of the School may permit a candidate to graduate with fewer than the stipulated credit points of study for an Award offered in the faculty.

HONOURS DEGREES IN BUSINESS AND COMMERCE

(Discipline areas: Accounting, Finance, Economics, Tourism, Management, Marketing, Human Resource Management)

General Requirements

- 1.1 A candidate for a degree with Honours shall, in the case of Commerce or Business:
 - (a) complete the requirements of the pass degree, or an equivalent degree from another university;
 - (b) include in the degree course the appropriate pass degree subjects, as set out in the program of study for each specific pass degree and described in the Master Schedule of Subjects as subjects with a prefix of BU, BX, CO, EC, MG or TO, or equivalent subjects from another university;
 - (c) include in the degree course honours subjects specified in the specific Honours programs.

Enrolment

- 2.1 An application by a student to enrol for an Honours degree must be approved by the Head of School. Normally, a student will not be permitted to enrol for an Honours degree unless a minimum average grade of Credit has been obtained in the pass degree subjects relevant to the field in which Honours is to be taken.
- 2.2 In the case of Honours programs in Commerce or Business a graduate who has been awarded an appropriate pass degree within the faculty may apply to enrol for an Honours degree provided the pass degree was awarded not more than two academic years prior to the year in which enrolment in an Honours degree is sought. Such a candidate shall comply with the requirements of the pass degree and shall complete such additional work (including pass degree subjects) as the Head of the appropriate program may prescribe.

Thesis

3. The subject of any thesis shall be approved by the relevant Head of program and the thesis shall usually be presented before 30 November in the candidate's final year of study, unless otherwise determined by the Head of School.

Degree specific requirements**The Honours program in Commerce**

- 4.1 A candidate for the degree shall:
 - 4.1.1 complete the specified program of study for the Pass degree to obtain 72 credit points; and
 - 4.1.2 obtain 24 credit points of subjects specified in the program of study for the Honours degree.
- 4.2 The degree with Honours may be taken in the fields of Accounting, Finance or Economics.

The Honours programs in Business specialising in Human Resource Management, Management, Marketing, or Tourism

- 5.1 A candidate for the degree shall:
 - 5.1.1 complete the specified program of study for the pass degree to obtain 72 credit points; and
 - 5.1.2 obtain 24 credit points of subjects specified in the program of study for the Honours degree.

DEGREES AND CERTIFICATES IN THE CREATIVE ARTS**Application of requirements**

- 1.1 In addition to the Faculty Award Requirements candidates must comply with the University Requirements for Undergraduate

Coursework Awards listed in this Course and Subject Handbook and specific degree or certificate Award Requirements.

- 1.2 In exceptional circumstances the Pro-Vice-Chancellor, where appropriate in consultation with the relevant Head of School, may dispense with or amend any requirements of or prescription by the University Requirements for Undergraduate Coursework Awards, Faculty Award Requirements and specific degree, diploma or certificate Award Requirements. Any major dispensation of the requirements should be reported to the faculty.
- 1.3 The Pro-Vice-Chancellor, where appropriate in consultation with the appropriate Head of School, may permit a candidate to graduate with fewer than the stipulated credit points of study for an Award offered in the faculty.

Enrolment in awards

2. A person who holds an award listed in General Requirements 1.1 and 1.2 may not be a candidate for that award in the same discipline.

Coherence of degree structure

3. The faculty must be satisfied that the completed Award constitutes a coherent whole.

Saving clause

4. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in these Requirements, the faculty may in any case in which it may deem it appropriate to do so, dispense with or suspend any condition of or prescription by these Requirements. Any such action by the faculty shall be recorded for the purposes of an annual review.

Requirements for completion of the course

- 1.1 A candidate for the pass degree shall follow an approved course of study as specified in the program shown under Undergraduate Courses and Majors to obtain 72 credit points.
- 1.2 A candidate may complete at least one major offered within the Bachelor of Business.

Majors

- 2.1 To complete a major students must successfully undertake the course of study shown in the Undergraduate Courses and Majors for the Bachelor of Business.
- 2.2 The major(s) are to be included on the testamur.

Period of candidature/completion

- 3.1 The normal minimum time for completion of the degree is three years full-time study or six years part-time.
- 3.2 The normal maximum time for completion is six years full-time study or 12 years part-time study.

Special notes/requirements

4. In selecting the subjects for enrolment in any year the candidate shall adhere as far as possible to the order in which the subjects of the course are set out in the Undergraduate Courses and Majors.

Advanced standing for prior study

- 5.1 Candidates for the award of the Bachelor of Business may apply to obtain advanced standing for previous tertiary study as detailed in the Advanced Standing for Previous Studies and Recognised Prior Learning Policy and associated procedures.
- 5.2 Advanced standing for previous study granted towards the Bachelor of Business may only be granted for study undertaken in the previous 10 years.

Subjects

Period of candidature/completion

- 3.1 The normal minimum time for completion of the degree is four years full-time study or eight years part-time.
- 3.2 The normal maximum time for completion is eight years full-time study or 12 years part-time study.
- 3.3 The maximum period for leave of absence is two years.

Majors

- 4.1 In the Bachelor of Business component of the joint degree a candidate may select a major as outlined in the Undergraduate Courses and Majors.
- 4.2 The named major is to be included on the testamur.

Special notes/requirements

- 6.1 Candidates for the award of the Bachelor of Business-Bachelor of Information Technology may apply for advanced standing for previous tertiary study in accordance with the Advanced Standing for Previous Studies and Recognised Prior Learning Policy and associated procedures.
- 6.2 Advanced standing for prior study granted towards the Bachelor of Business-Bachelor of Information Technology may only be granted for study undertaken in the previous 12 years.

Administration of the joint degree

- The normal minimum time for completion of the degree is five years full-time study or 10 years part-time.
- The normal maximum time for completion is 10 years full-time study or 12 years part-time study.
- The maximum period for leave of absence is two years.

Majors

- In the Bachelor of Business component of the joint degree a candidate may select a major as outlined in the Undergraduate Courses and Majors.
- The Accounting major is a compulsory requirement of the Bachelor of Business (Accounting) component of the joint degree and is separately outlined in the Undergraduate Courses and Majors.
- The named major is to be included on the testamur.

- In selecting subjects for enrolment in any year the candidate shall adhere as far as possible to the order in which the subjects of the course are set out in the Undergraduate Courses and Majors.

Advanced standing for prior study

Award requirements

- Honours in the joint degree may be completed as: BBus(Hons)-LLB(Hons); or BBus(Hons)-LLB; or BBus-LLB(Hons) depending on the requirements of individual candidates.
- A candidate for the Honours degree shall normally pursue studies as follows: BBus(Hons)-LLB(Hons) — six years to obtain 144 credit points; BBus(Hons)-LLB — six years to obtain 144 credit points; BBus-LLB(Hons) — five years to obtain 120 credit points.
- Candidates undertaking honours shall complete the requirements of the joint pass degree followed by the requirements of the normal honours year in either or both components of the joint degree depending on the degree in which the candidate enrolls.

Period of candidature/completion

- The normal minimum time for completion of the degree is five years full-time study.
- The normal maximum time for completion is seven years full-time study.
- Part-time candidates, or those who are unable to complete the course of study within seven years, shall consult with the relevant Heads of School to determine the time within which the requirements for the degree must be completed.

Majors

- In the Bachelor of Business component of the joint degree a candidate may select a major as outlined in the Undergraduate Courses and Majors.
- The named major is to be included on the testamur.

Special notes/requirements

Requirements for the degree

- 1.2 A candidate for the Honours degree shall normally pursue studies as follows:
 BBus(Hons)-BPsych(Hons) — six years to obtain 144 credit points;
 BBus(Hons)-BPsych — one additional year to obtain 24 credit points;
 BBus-BPsych(Hons) — five years to obtain 120 credit points.
- 1.3 Candidates undertaking honours shall complete the requirements of the joint pass degree followed by the normal honours requirements in either or both components of the joint degree depending on the degree in which the candidate enrolls.

- 1.1 Honours in the joint degree may be completed as:
 BCom(Hons)-LLB(Hons); BCom(Hons)-LLB;
 BCom-LLB(Hons)
- depending on the requirements of individual candidates.
- 1.2 The completion time for these Honours courses, if undertaken in the normal full-time study load of 24 credit points in a year is:
 BCom(Hons)-LLB(Hons) — 6.5 years to obtain 150 credit points;
 BCom(Hons)-LLB — 6.5 years to obtain 150 credit points;
 BCom-LLB(Hons) — 5.5 years to obtain 126 credit points.
- However, students wishing to complete these courses in less time may undertake a study load in excess of the normal full-time study load of 24 credit points in a year, with the approval of the Faculty Pro-Vice-Chancellor.
- 1.3 Candidates undertaking honours shall complete the requirements of the joint pass degree followed by the requirements of the normal Honours year in either or both components of the joint degree depending on the degree in which the candidate enrolls.

BACHELOR OF COMMUNICATION DESIGN WITH HONOURS

Entry to honours degree course

1. A person who has qualified for the award of the degree of Bachelor of Communication Design (the pass degree) may enrol for the Honours degree in either Research or Practice if that person has:
- 1.1 for Research, obtained in the pass degree the grade of Distinction or better in a research-based and practice-based communication design subject specified by the Head of the School; or
- 1.2 for Practice, obtained in the pass degree the grade of Distinction or better in a practice-based communication design subject and the grade of Credit or better in a research-based communication design subject specified by the Head of the School; and
- 1.3 has obtained the approval of the Head of the School.

2. A person who holds a degree of this or another University deemed by the faculty to be equivalent to the degree of Bachelor of Communication Design may be permitted to enrol for the Honours degree where the Head of the School is satisfied that the degree justifies candidature and that the person has met the equivalent of the requirements specified in 1.1 or 1.2 above.

Requirements for the degree

3. The normal minimum time for completion of the degree is one year of full-time study or two years of part-time study. The maximum period is two years of full-time study and four years of part-time study.
4. The program for either Research or Practice shall total 24 credit points and be as shown under Undergraduate Courses and Majors.

Examination

5. Except with the approval of the faculty a candidate shall not be permitted to present more than once for the final examination.

Subjects

2. Subjects as outlined in the Undergraduate Courses and Majors will be required for satisfactory completion of the degree.

Majors

- 3.1 The following major is available within the Bachelor of Creative Arts:
 Media and Performance.
- 3.2 To complete a major, students must undertake the appropriate program of study as shown under Undergraduate Courses and Majors.
- 3.3 The major is not to be included on the testamur.

Period of candidature/completion

Practical/professional placement

9. Unless the faculty otherwise determines, advanced standing gained for any subject shall be cancelled 10 years after the date of the examination upon which the advanced standing is based if by then the candidate has not completed the course.

Award requirements

- 1.1 A candidate for the pass degree shall follow an approved course of study as specified in the program shown under Undergraduate Courses and Majors to obtain 72 credit points. This shall include the specified core subjects, a creative arts major, a creative arts minor and elective subjects.
- 1.2 Studies are available in a number of discipline areas and candidates must choose one of the Creative Arts discipline majors outlined in the relevant schedule shown under Undergraduate Courses and Majors.

Period of candidature/completion

- 2.1 The normal minimum time for completion of the degree is two years full-time study or four years part-time for those students who have already completed a relevant TAFE diploma.
- 2.2 The normal minimum time for completion of the degree for students who have not yet completed a relevant TAFE diploma will depend on the length of the candidature at TAFE. 7. Unless the faculty otherwise determines, advanced standing gained for any subject shall be cancelled 10 years after the date of the examination upon which the advanced standing is based if by then the candidate has not completed the course.

- 1.1 A candidate for the pass degree in Law shall follow a course of study as specified in the program shown under Undergraduate Courses and Majors, to obtain 96 credit points. The time for completion of the degree is four years full-time.
- 1.2 Candidates enrolling in Law who have completed a bachelor degree at this or another University in any other field of study (graduate candidates) shall follow a course of study as specified under the heading Graduate Entry Program shown under Undergraduate Courses and Majors, to obtain 72 credit points. The time for completion of the degree is three years of full-time study.

Limitation of enrolment

- 3.3 The subjects selected shall be in accordance with the majors in Music with Honours shown under Undergraduate Courses and Majors.

Resubmission for Final Honours

4. A candidate shall not be permitted to present more than once for the final examination in the same honours discipline, but may be permitted by the examiners to resubmit the honours thesis or comparable prescribed work.

Award of the degree

5. In the award of Honours, consideration shall be given to the candidate's record throughout the course.

5. Pass Conceded will not be accepted.

Advanced standing for prior study

Candidates for this award may apply for advanced standing for previous tertiary study as detailed in the Advanced Standing for Previous Studies and Recognised Prior Learning Policy and associated procedures. Advanced standing for previous study granted towards the Bachelor of New Media Arts may only be granted for study undertaken in the previous five years.

Constitution of the degree

- The subjects selected shall be in accordance with the selected major in Theatre with Honours shown under Undergraduate Courses and Majors.

Entry to honours degree course

- A person enrolled for the degree of Bachelor of Theatre may be invited by the Head of School to enrol for the degree of Bachelor of Theatre with Honours in either:
 - research, if that person has obtained at least a Distinction in both a research-based and a practice-based theatre subject as specified by the Head of School;
 - practice, if that person has obtained at least a Distinction in a practice-based theatre subject and a Credit in a research-based theatre subject as specified by the Head of School.
- A person who holds or is eligible to hold the degree of Bachelor of Theatre of this or another University, or who holds an equivalent degree, may be permitted to enrol in the Honours course where the Head of School is satisfied that the degree justifies candidature for Honours. School requirements include a provision that candidates entering after graduation shall complete such requirements as in 2 above, as the Head of School may specify.

Resubmission for final honours

- A candidate shall not be permitted to present more than once for the final examination in the same Honours discipline, but may be permitted by the examiners to re-submit the Honours thesis or comparable prescribed work.
- In the award of Honours, consideration shall be given to the candidate's record throughout the course.

Administration of the degree

- The degree shall be administered by the Pro-Vice-Chancellor of the Faculty of Law, Business and the Creative Arts.

Award Requirements

 - include in the degree course the appropriate pass degree subjects, as set out in the program of study or equivalent subjects from another university;

Enrolment

Such a candidate shall comply with the Requirements of the pass degree and shall complete such additional work (including pass degree subjects) as the Head of the appropriate program may prescribe.

Thesis

- The subject of any thesis shall be approved by the Head of School and the thesis shall usually be presented before 30 November in the candidate's final year of study, unless otherwise determined by the Head of School.

BACHELOR OF VISUAL ARTS WITH HONOURS

1. To qualify for the degree a candidate must have completed subjects of a total value of 96 credit points in accordance with these Requirements. The normal time for completion of the degree is four years of full-time study.

Constitution of the degree

2. The subjects selected shall be in accordance with the program in Visual Arts with Honours (Research), or Visual Arts with Honours (Professional Practice) shown under Undergraduate Courses and Majors.

Entry to honours degree course

- 3.1 A candidate enrolled for the degree of Bachelor of Visual Arts may be invited by the Head of School to enrol for the degree of Bachelor of Visual Arts with Honours (Research) if that candidate has obtained 72 credit points by successful completion of the level 1, level 2 and level 3 subjects prescribed in the program, provided that the grade of at least Distinction has been obtained in the following level 3 subjects of Visual Arts Practice and Art History and Theory; and that the grade of at least Credit has been obtained in the level 3 subject of Drawing.
- 3.2 A candidate enrolled for the degree of Bachelor of Visual Arts may be invited by the Head of the School to enrol for the degree of Bachelor of Visual Arts with Honours (Professional Practice) if that candidate has obtained 72 credit points by successful completion of the level 1, level 2 and level 3 subjects prescribed in the program, provided that the grade of at least Distinction has been obtained in the following level 3 subject of Visual Arts Practice and that the grade of at least Credit has been obtained in the level 3 subjects of Drawing and Art History and Theory.
- 3.3 A person who holds the degree of Bachelor of Visual Arts of this or another University, or who holds an equivalent qualification, may be permitted to enrol in the Honours course where the Head of the School is satisfied that the qualification justifies candidature in one of the honours specialisations currently offered by Visual Arts. Requirements include a provision that candidates entering after graduation shall complete such specifications of Requirement 2 of the Bachelor of Visual Arts as the Head of School may specify.

Resubmission for final honours

4. A candidate shall not be permitted to present more than once for the final examination in the same honours discipline, but may be permitted by the examiners to resubmit the Honours thesis or comparable prescribed work.

Award of the degree

5. In the award of Honours, consideration shall be given to the candidate's record throughout the course.

DIPLOMA OF BUSINESS

Requirements for completion of the course
